WATCHMAN KILLS A TRAMP

F. W. Graves Shot and Killed
Unknown Man Who Had Got
ten Into Shoe Factory.

An unknown man was shot and killed in the boiler room of the Moberly Plant of the Brown Shoe factory this morning at about 2:15 o'clock by Night Watchman F. W. Graves.

The body was removed to Van Cleve's undertaking establishment where hundreds of people have viewed it today but none of them however are able to identify it. The body is that of a man a-

man and one entered his heart, going clear through his body.

Mr. Graves is about fifty years of age, a man of family, and is not quick of action. He favorably impressed the jury with his statement.

The coroner, S. C. Adams, and the following jury conducted the inquest: Sam Turner, W. S. Turner, J. W. Wight, Wm. Biggers, L. E. Shipp, James Childers.

Description Of Dead Man.

The dead man is 5 feet 10 inches in height; weight 170 pounds; dark brown hair; blue eyes; thin red mustache; coat was off and his blue flannel shirt and bibbed overalls were on. It is thought that the man beat his way into Moberly on one of the night
