Educator opposes plan to offer ASU and community college courses at PUHS

The president of the Maricopa County Community College District said he will recommend that the district board "do all it can to develop an educational work at Phoenix Union High School."

Dr. John F. Price, administrative head of the district, said he will suggest that the district "no longer have any interest in a plan that would result in junior college and Arizona State University courses being offered in conjunction with high school courses at the PUHS project."

Price's statement was greeted with surprise by two advocates of the plan. Dwight Patterson, a former president and current member of the community college district board, said Mrs. Carolyn Warner, a member of the Phoenix Union High School District Board, indicated it has no intention of opposing a high school on the campus. Instead, it has said it wants to expand the facility to include representation from the city college and ASU academic program.

Another motive, she added, is provided by the energy crisis. The PUHS campus would be easier for many people, including businessmen, taking courses, to reach.

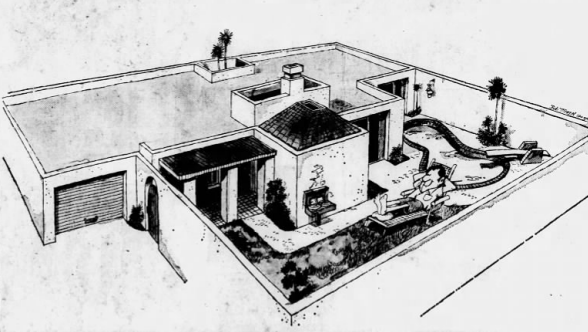

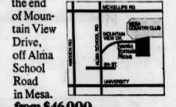
